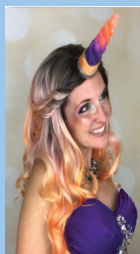

## MASK UPDATE

The Illinois Department of Public Health and Cook County Department of Public Health plan to lift the mask mandate if COVID-19 metrics meet certain levels. If this happens, we will make masking optional in the Library. The only exception for now will be in closed door one-on-one appointments such as Tech Consultations, social work meetings, etc. The Library continues to support anyone, including staff, who choose to wear masks while in the Library.

The Library reserves the right to require masks at any time and we will be monitoring the COVID situation to determine if changes in our requirements are necessary. We will continue to offer a variety of services that make using the Library quick and easy. We will continue to offer masks to patrons who want them. The last two years have been challenging, but, once again we ask for your flexibility and support as we move to this next phase.
