
Process Portfolio- Critical Investigation

Your task is to complete **4 Google Slides pages** of **Critical Investigation** where you investigate the style, concepts, materials, processes, and techniques of other artists. Below are 2 examples of Process Portfolio pages that illustrate how museum visits and virtual museum visits inform personal artmaking. Your 4 Google Slides should be 50% images and 50% text and show images of the artist's work as well as your own work that has been influenced by this investigation.

This artist research <u>can</u> be a continuation of a project that you have already started; you can continue to research different artists to develop your emerging style and ongoing body of work.

Critical investigation (4 slides)

- Investigation of artists, artworks and artistic genres, communicating your growing awareness of how this investigation influences and impacts upon your own developing art-making practices and intentions.
- Annotated images of artists' works, all work must be cited Source/Artist/ Title/Date/Material.
- Experiments with using the style or technique of an artist and future project planning.
- Written reflections on the connections between an investigated artist and your own work.
