The Academic Regalia

The ceremonial garb of the academic procession, known as the Academic Regalia, can trace its origins back to the universities of the 11th and 12th centuries. Today's academic life first took form during the Middle Ages, when this regalia served as the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The principal features of the academic dress are the gown and cap.

The Gown: The origins of the flowing academic gown can be traced back to the 12th century. While it originally may have been worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings, it has evolved over the centuries into a symbol of scholarly democracy. The gown's purpose is to cover any attire indicative of rank or social standing, thereby underscoring the equalizing nature of education. The Bachelor's gown features pointed sleeves and is typically worn closed. The Master's gown, on the other hand, has an oblong sleeve open at the wrist, with the base of the sleeve hanging down in the traditional manner. For the Doctorate, the gown boasts bell-shaped sleeves and is distinguished by black velvet facing on the front and three velvet bars across the sleeves.

The Cap: The academic cap symbolizes both the freedom of scholarship and the accompanying dignity and responsibility it bestows upon the wearer. As recorded in old poetry, the square shape of the cap represents the book, further reinforcing its symbolic connection to scholarship.

The Hood: Historically, the hood was used to cover the head until it was replaced by the academic cap. Today, academic hoods are lined with the official color(s) of the degree-conferring college or university, adding another layer of distinction and tradition to the regalia.
